Tracey D. Turner (she/her) is a graduate of Carnegie-Mellon University and named Actress of the Year in 1997 by Pittsburgh Newsweekly for her portrayal as Prospero in The Tempest with Timespace. Previously with SCSC, she has appeared as Cerimon, Dionyza, and the Bawd in Pericles, Old Sinbad in The Seven Voyages of Sinbad, Duke Frederick and Duke Senior in As You Like It, and as Scrooge in A Christmas Carol; A Radio Drama as well as director of the Pittsburgh Premiere of The Twelve Dates of Christmas by Ginna Hoben and the staged reading of Martin Luther King Jr.'s Letter From the Birmingham Jail. She has also directed a production of Andrew Lloyd Webber's Tell Me on a Sunday at Winnipesaukee Playhouse in Meredith, NH. Other local credits include Berowne and Jaquinettta in Love's Labour's Lost and Queen and Belarius in Cymbeline with Pittsburgh Shakespeare in the Parks, Minnie Kinkaid in Lifting with Kuntu Repertory Theatre, Stella Marr in Racing Demon with PICT Classic Theatre, and Gertrude in Hamlet with Pittsburgh Theater Laboratory. She is the proud mother of Micah-Shai and Moriah Turner.

Jeffrey Chips Director

Jeffrey Chips (he/him) is the Founder and Artistic Director of Steel City Shakespeare Center, having served as producer, director, writer, and/or performer on over fifteen productions, including *Pericles, As You Like It, A Christmas Carol, Richard III, The Seven Voyages of Sinbad, The Tempest, Much Ado About Nothing,* and *Twelfth Night.* He has also directed productions of *Cymbeline* and *King Lear* with Pittsburgh Shakespeare in the Parks and previously worked as an understudy with the American Shakespeare Center on productions of *The Tempest, Henry V, Much Ado About Nothing,* and *Richard III.* He holds a BA in theatre from Allegheny College and an MLitt and MFA in Shakespeare and Performance from Mary Baldwin University, earned while training at the American Shakespeare Center. He is a resident of West View and serves on the staff and board of directors of the West View Hub, and thanks his wife, Megan, and sons, Samuel, Isaac, and Joshua, for all of their love and inspiration.



William Shakespeare was born in Stratford-upon-Avon, England in 1564, the son of John Shakespeare, a glovemaker, and Mary Arden, the daughter of a prominent Catholic family in Stratford. At the age of 18, he married Anne Hathaway, and together they had three children, Susanna, Judith, and Hamnet.

In the late 1580s/early 1590s,

Shakespeare arrived in London around the same time the English Navy defeated the Spanish Armada, establishing England as the strongest military power in Europe and London as the major hub of European culture and art. He joined the Lord Chamberlain's Men as an actor, shareholder, and writer and also gained fame and influence as a writer of poems, including 154 sonnets.

After the death of Queen Elizabeth in 1603 and the arrival of King James, the Lord Chamberlain's Men became the King's Men and served as the main playing company for the Royal Court. In his career, he wrote several of the most beloved works in the history of the English language, including A Midsummer Night's Dream, Romeo and Juliet, Twelfth Night, Much Ado About Nothing, Hamlet, Othello, Macbeth, The Tempest, and many more. In 1614, he sold his share in the King's Men and retired to Stratford for a brief time before his death in 1616.

Seven years later, in 1623, members of the King's Men undertook the effort of collecting all of Shakespeare's plays and publishing his First Folio. With the exception of the King James Bible, Shakespeare's First Folio is perhaps the most celebrated and most studied printed work in the history of the English language. Today we credit Shakespeare as the author of 38 plays that, over the course of 400 years, have been translated into hundreds of languages and performed throughout the world.

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
